Being able to listen to music and understand how and why it makes us feel a certain way is a very powerful tool for us as performers.

The more we listen to different types of music, the greater our knowledge and musical interests become, and we develop more language for describing what we are hearing.

These activities have been designed by the Victorian Music Teachers' Association Inc. (VMTA) to support direct application of the Victorian Curriculum & Assessment Authority (VCAA) responding outcomes for F-10 Music and VCE, as well as aligning with the ACARA outcomes in this area.

The activities use program excerpts from <u>3MBS - Intermezzo</u>. 3MBS was finally launched on 1 July 1975. It was the first radio station to broadcast on the new FM band in Victoria and paved the way for the establishment of other community broadcasters. <u>Learn more about 3MBS</u>.
